

Frequently Asked Questions

1. Can I apply again if I already applied?

Yes, when applying again, please indicate on your name that you are re-applying.

2. Can girls aged 10-19 apply independently?

No, only adolescent girls associated with a girl-led, girl-centric network/ collective/ organisation are eligible to apply.

3. Why is having Organisational Safeguarding and Learning Focal Point (OSLFP) mandatory for adolescent girl applicants?

This is because we currently do not have sufficient capacity to support independent adolescent girls to participate in AGAC. AGIP is a small global coalition that currently only works online with voluntary members and limited resources. Safeguarding and meaningful engagement are at the heart of everything we do therefore we rely on support from girl-led, girl-centric network/ collective/ organisation to ensure adolescent girls are supported appropriately.

4. Who can be the OSLFP for adolescent girl applicants and what is expected from them?

The OSLFP role can be held by an adult in a leadership role in your respective organisation/ network/ collective. This person will be responsible for ensuring the safety and wellbeing of the Girl Advisor as well as supporting their learning throughout the term of their membership to the Advisory Committee. They are expected to commit approximately two (2) hours per month on average for dedicated roles and responsibilities with an openness to provide further need-based support to the Girl Advisor.

5. Is a CV/resume mandatory for all applicants?

No, CV/resumes are only required for young women applicants aged 20-24.

6. I don't have LinkedIn, can I e-mail my resume to AGIP?

No, if you do not have a LinkedIn profile, you can upload your resume on online platforms like Google Drive, One Drive, Box, Drop Box etc and the share the link of that file in the online application form.

Please do not e-mail your resume to AGIP. Due to large volume of applications and limited resources, keeping track of all e-mails is not possible for us.

7. How many members will be selected to join the Committee?

8 adolescent girls [10-19] and 4 young women [20-24].

8. Is it a must for your organization to be registered?

No, adolescent girls and young women associated with independent movements and collectives are welcome to apply.

9. How do you ensure sustainability of this group if set up? Will this be a yearly recruitment?

The journey of the first cohort will be collectively designed with the successfully selected members. Further steps will be discussed during the evaluation with the Advisors of the first cohort because we want their experiences and recommendations to guide this process.

10. Is there a travel provision?

No, the Advisory Committee will operate online therefore no travel will be required for it. However, financial and non-financial support will be provided to ensure meaningful online engagement.

11. Do you have to apply for the additional finances separately?

Yes, this can be requested in the same form while filling out the application for adolescent girls aged 10-19. Please note that this is only available for specific organisations.

12. Is the selection of the members country wise?

No, the selection of Advisors will be based on multiple criteria as mentioned in the Terms of Reference.
